## **Graduation Requirements**

Students must complete the program as outlined below. Minimum grades of C- are required in the Kinesiology and Communication Core. A minimum program GPA of 2.00 is required to be eligible to graduate.

## **Program Requirements**

Students must complete 120 credit hours (120h) as follows:

- 1. The Kinesiology Core (51h).
- 2. All of the following (12h): BIOL 1853, BIOL 1863, COMM 1013, KINE 1100, KINE 3100, MATH 1253.
- 3. 18h of Kinesiology electives (9h must be at the 3000-level or higher).
- 4. 6h from the Faculty of Arts.
- 5. 12h from the Faculty of Arts or Faculty of Pure and Applied Science.
- 6. 21h university electives.

# Failing a course vs. failing to meet graduation requirements

- Failing a course = F, you have not passed the course & need to retake it
  - If the course is a prerequisite for another course, you must earn a passing grade before you can register for the other course
- Example: KINE 1413 Hum Anat 1 is a prereq for KINE 2413 App Hum Phys 1
  - If "F", register for KINE 1413 but not KINE 2413
  - If "D-, D, D+", register for KINE 1413 & KINE 2413

- Failing to meet graduation requirements = passing a core course requiring a minimum grade of C- with a grade of D-, D or D+
  - You need a C- in Kine Core courses & Comm to graduate; if you receive a grade of less than C- in a core course you will need to take it again
  - If a core course is a prerequisite for another course, because you earned a passing grade, you can register for the other course

## **Registering for a course in Self Service**

- 1. Log into myAcadia > Self Service, using Acadia username and password.
- 2. Select Course Catalog
- 3. Select a Subject
- 4. Select the appropriate term you wish to view. You are able to filter the results.
- 5. Select a course to add to your plan, and select **add Section to Schedule**. A pop up will ask again if you wish to continue, select **Add Section**.
- 6. You should see a pop up in the upper right hand corner that says the course has been added to your plan.
- 7. Once you've selected your courses for the term, return to the main page and select Student Planning.
- 8. Select Go to Plan and Schedule.
- 9. Change your term selector to the term you wish to see (e.g. 2021 Fall) using the forward arrow.
- 10. Your selected courses should now be visible to you in your plan.
- 11. Your planned courses are lists on the left-hand side of the page.
- 12. Select Register to complete the process.

Note: To register for a course with a lab, add <u>both</u> the course and lab sections before selecting **Register**
