Research Focus:

Jamie's honours research is focused on the transition of athletes from high school to university sport. Student athletes are faced with changes in academics, athletics, social life, activities of daily living and other domains of life. Previous literature generally focused on transitions out of sport instead of transitions within sport. The objective of her study is to gain insight into the different challenges and experiences of first year student athletes through semi-structured interviews. Common themes within interviews will be assessed through thematic analysis which may highlight ways to improve future student athletes' transitions.
