
Sabrina Nunn HONOURS RESEARCH



Research Focus:

Sabrina's honours research, "Past Action, Current Challenges, and Future Initiatives – An Investigation into the Hurdles for Achieving Gender Equity in Nova Scotia" is a case study based on the impact of a November 2017 gender equity meeting in Nova Scotia reporting on the individual experiences of both organizers and participants. Despite it being collectively agreed that gender gaps have narrowed in general, there are still inequitable differences prevalent in society – specifically in sport. In Canada today, there are still 84% of adult females who do not take part in sport.
